It offers advanced features and AI-powered tools, while also simplifying many small, time-consuming tasks in one place — such as creating QR codes, editing PDFs, enhancing profile photos, removing image backgrounds, editing videos, combining files, converting formats (like SVG for use with a Glowforge or vinyl cutter), and much more. In this hands-on session, you'll learn how to navigate Adobe Express and pick up practical tips to streamline your workflow.

For Mi'kmaq peoples, the relationship with the land has always been grounded in reciprocity — a deep understanding of giving and receiving in balance with Mother Earth. Treaty Education for all of us starts in much the same way: by reflecting on our own personal connection to the land. In this session, educators will step out of the classroom and onto the lawn at Coronation Park next to BHS. Using the land as our teacher, we will explore simple, meaningful ways to reconnect with Mother Earth. Through guided experiences, participants will have the opportunity to slow down, observe, reflect, and engage with the natural world around them. The goal is to inspire educators to carry these experiences back into their classrooms — helping students build their own connections to the land and deepening their understanding of Treaty relationships in a way that is personal, respectful, and rooted in experience.
